

EYFS – Mrs Willington, Miss Niven, Mrs Dobson and Miss Spenceley

Nursery's story of the week has been, 'The Tale of Peter Rabbit'. Nursery have absolutely loved this story; they have prepared vegetables from Mr McGregor's garden to make vegetable soup, compared weight using vegetables, and completed some fantastic story retells. Nursery have been very lucky as we have had our very own Peter Rabbit in our garden; Nursery have been keeping a careful eye on him and have even put out some fruit and vegetables, for him and his family to nibble on.

This week, Reception celebrated Earth Day on Monday by creating posters to remind us how to look after our special earth and all the things we can do to make to make a difference. We have also continued our safari journey by making parrots and a landscape safari in a box, where we discussed which animals we would see, what the land and the weather would be like.

Before Easter, we were learning about the life cycle of caterpillars. Over the last few weeks, the children have been observing the life cycle of a caterpillar by having our very own in class. This week, after much anticipation, our little caterpillars became beautiful butterflies and were released into the wild. Well done for taking such good care of our little friends!





What have we been up to?

Y1/2 – Mrs. Garnett and Mrs. Aislabie

This week, we have been busy writing up our own short narrative based on the film clip, 'Bubbles'. We created a descriptive setting of our own, explaining where the girl could go to next.

In maths, Year 1 have been focusing on word problems and looking at the key words to help them recognise if the problem is an addition or subtraction calculation. In Year 2, we have continued to learn about money and add notes and coins together.

During our science lesson, we looked at what plants need to grow. We then planted our own sunflower seed, which we will continue to observe until it has fully grown.

Our PSHE lessons this term are focused around relationships. This week, during circle time, we talked about the qualities of a good friend. We then looked at a range of statements and decided if they were qualities of a good friend or not.

Y3/4 – Miss Humpherson and Mrs Skilbeck

This week, in English, the children have been getting creative in Willy Wonka's Chocolate Factory and creating their own recipe for a new fantastic Wonka creation, making sure they are using imperative verbs, expanded noun phrases and time adverbs in their writing.

The children started their new RE topic this week and were introduced to the Vesak festival in Buddhism. They made and decorated lanterns and flags to begin celebrating this festival.

In maths, the Year 3's have been learning to add and subtract money, while the Year 4's have been getting to grips with using and comparing decimals.

It was Earth Day on Monday and this year the children wrote pledges on what they can do to make sure that they are helping our planet; they came up with ideas like picking up litter and buying second hand clothes from places such as 'Vinted', to try and reduce our waste.










What have we been up to?
