

Nursery – Autumn 2

Topic

In Autumn 2, we will be exploring our new topic 'Sparkle and Shine.' We will delve into Bonfire night, animals of the night and Christmas. The children will listen to a variety of stories that will give an insight into nocturnal animals, the change in season and celebrations.

Communication and Language (Speaking and Listening)

Language is a key focus for us in Nursery. Our 'Wondrous Words', new vocabulary from books we read, provide us with a starting point for nurturing new and exciting vocabulary. When children are accessing our stimulating provision, we encourage the use of simple sentences with 3-4 words and provide a strong model to develop this. We also develop the children's ability to ask questions and give a running commentary of what they are doing, particularly praising the use of new 'Wondrous Words'. Our topic themed role play areas encourage interaction with others in small groups alongside our small world and puppet play areas. Snack time is an ideal opportunity for language development – asking questions and developing manners such as please and thank you.

Literacy (Reading and Writing)

In Autumn 2, we will continue to model reading, using books and taking care of books; we take time to show the children how to hold books the correct way up, treat books carefully and develop a love of listening to and learning from both stories and non-fiction books. The children are encouraged to repeat words and phrases from stories that are read to them. Writing at this stage is simply mark making and chunky tools, such as crayons, become the children's first writing tool. Simple shapes such as vertical and horizontal lines, as well as circular shapes, are the expected method of recording.

Maths (Number and Shape, Space and Measure)

Singing number songs and listening to number stories happens continuously throughout the day. Adults model mathematical vocabulary such as one, two, three, more, less, lots and fewer, which helps the children to understand and apply their new maths based 'Wondrous Words' in both independent play and adult led activities.

We will engage in a variety of different counting focused activities, this will allow children to develop a sense of number and amounts. Awareness to shapes in the environment will continue, allowing children to access 2D and 3D shapes which are then described with mathematical vocabulary to support their understanding.

Personal Development (P.S.H.E.)

Our focus in PSHE will be celebrating differences! The children will learn that everyone is different, to include others when they play, to know how to help someone if they are upset and how to problem solve.

Understanding the World (Geography, History, Science and Computing)

Our science focus will be on animals and how they live and grow. We will also learn about sound, light and space, as we stargaze. We will use our ears to listen to night-time sounds and how sounds can be changed to be quieter or louder.

We will learn about the difference between day and night. We will do this by play sorting games to show our learning about night-time jobs and routine. We will also be looking at life in a contrasting country to ours and think about what is the same and what is different. Throughout all of these activities, we will learn how to use an iPad to take photographs and use Mini-Mash on Purple Mash.

Expressive Arts (Art and Music)

Singing and performing songs is at the heart of our nursery musical experience. We teach a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs to support this. Our fabulous environment allows children access to a range of percussion instruments where they can become composers in their own right. In art, we will continue to focus on simple drawing skills using a range of materials, tools, and techniques. Children are taught how to experiment with colour and design to create some of their first masterpieces.

Physical Development (P.E.)

Both gross and fine motor skill development is key at the nursery stage. Our 'Finger Gym' will provide many opportunities to manipulate objects such as pinching and posting objects. This half term the children will be introduced to structured movement through the topic of 'Fantasy and Adventure'. They will spend time learning basic principles of a PE lesson such as finding space, freezing on command, using and sharing equipment and working individually, with a partner and group. They will take part in activities which will develop fundamental movement skills such as running, jumping, skipping.

Religious Education (R.E.)

Special Books - We will be listening to information from staff and members of the community about who is special to us, what our beliefs are and what our role is. We will be sharing a little bit about ourselves, who is special to us and the different beliefs we may have with our peers. Our primary focus will be Christianity and the Christmas holidays.
